She holds a BA (*cum laude*) from the University of San Francisco and an MA from the University of Hawaii. Claire was a teacher for 28 years; served for 8 years as the vice president of an educational non-profit in Alexandria, VA; and currently consults with federal agencies, such as the James Madison Memorial Fellowship Foundation, and non-profits to promote history and civic education.
